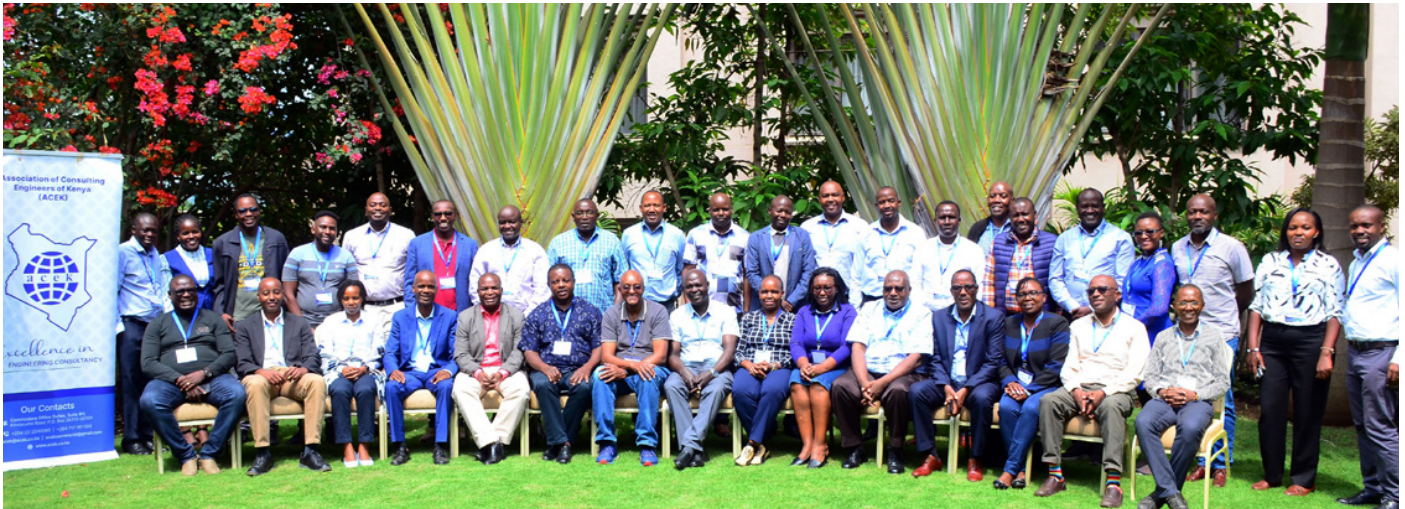

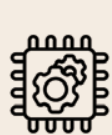

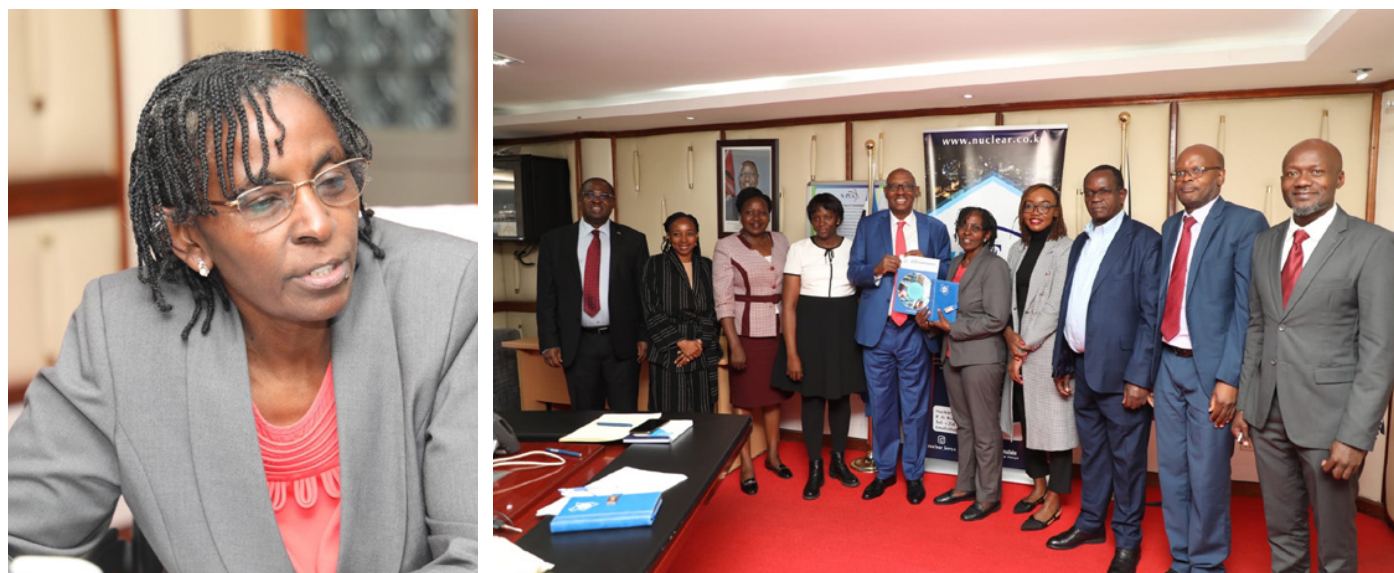
Viva Fiberglass to Sponsor and Present at ACEK Conference 2025

ACEK Engages NCIA on Strengthening Dispute Resolution in the Construction Sector



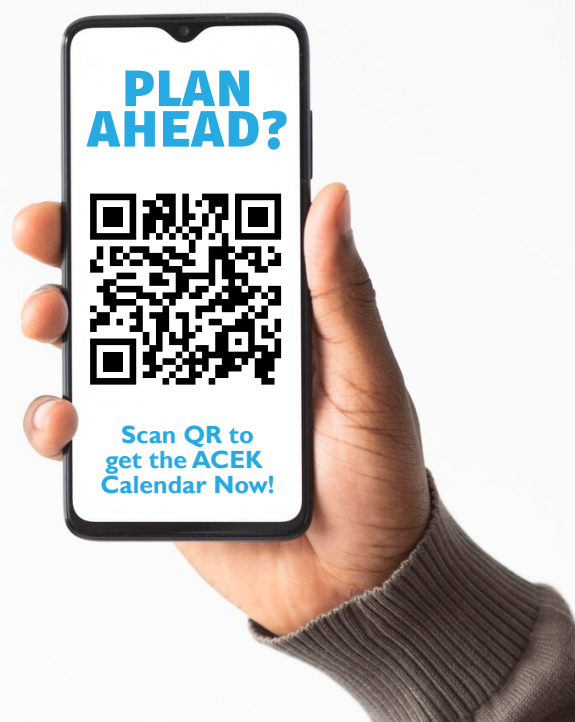

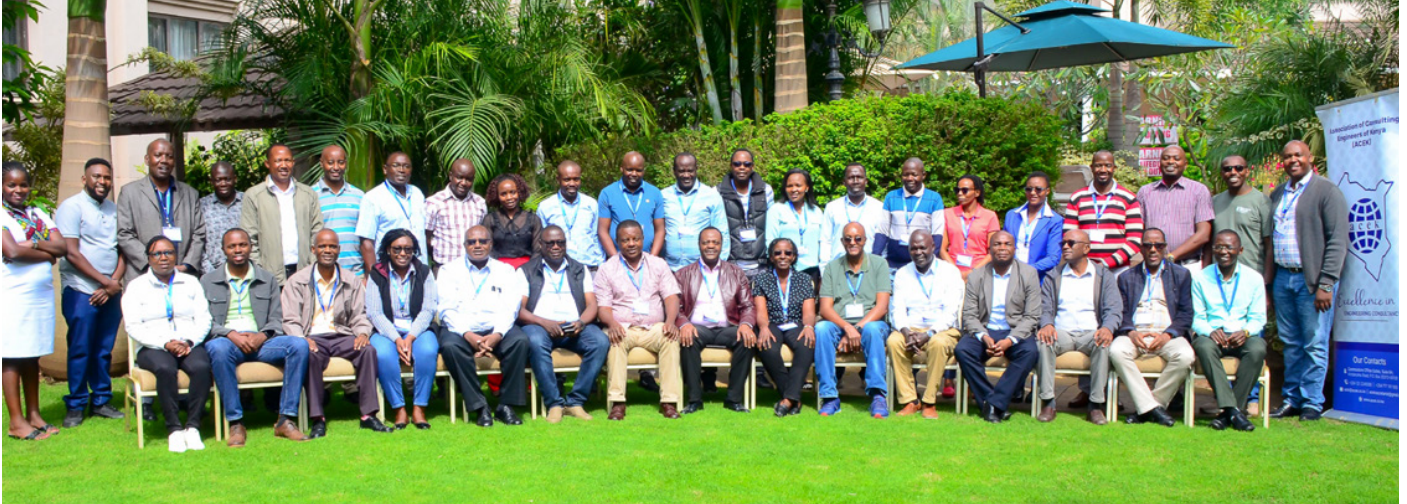

On 2nd July 2025, ACEK hosted a timely webinar on Resource Identification, Allocation, Optimization, and Infrastructure Financing, bringing together professionals from across the built environment sector.

The session focused on strengthening project planning, aligning resources effectively, and exploring innovative financing mechanisms such as infrastructure bonds and Kenya's Road Annuity Program.

The webinar was led by Bahati Kerubo, an Infrastructure Finance & PPP Consultant at the World Bank, who shared deep insights into financing models and practical approaches to resource optimization in engineering projects.

ACEK Concludes FIDIC Contracts Training with KenGen



From 16th to 20th June 2025, ACEK conducted a comprehensive FIDIC training programme with the Kenya Electricity Generating Company (KenGen), aimed at enhancing capacity in contract administration and dispute avoidance under the 2017 Rainbow Suite. The sessions, led by Eng. Paul Karekezi, brought together key project personnel to strengthen technical knowledge and delivery efficiency across KenGen's infrastructure portfolio.

The training began with a focus on procurement procedures, including project strategy development, consultant appointments, tender evaluation, and contract award processes. Participants then explored practical aspects of contract implementation, such as financial control, interim payments, supervision, progress monitoring, contract amendments, and claims management—all designed to improve project oversight and reduce disputes.

The programme concluded with an engaging group work session, where teams applied the principles learned to real-world contract scenarios. This interactive approach reinforced collaborative problem-solving and gave participants hands-on tools to manage timelines, costs, and risks effectively. ACEK remains committed to supporting public institutions like KenGen through targeted capacity-building that promotes governance, accountability, and successful project outcomes.
